Teacher Assessed Grades

Your Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGs) have now been submitted to the relevant exam board. These have been determined in accordance with JCQ guidance¹.

To help you decide whether you have grounds for an appeal you need to;

- 1) consult our centre policy Centre Policy Aguinas College
- 2) consider the sources of evidence used to determine your grade along with any grades/marks associated with them, this information was shared with you by your tutor
- 3) submit a request for details of any special circumstances that may have been taken into account (if applicable)

For both stages of the process you will need to submit an appeals request and give your written consent for us to conduct the appeal or submit it to the exam board on your behalf. *It's extremely important to note that your grades can go down, go up or stay the same.*

To begin the appeals process you should, after consideration of points 1 to 3 above, email tagappeals21@aquinas.ac.uk and indicate in the subject line if this is a **priority appeal** for University or Apprenticeship places. Priority appeals will be processed first, we will then endeavour to respond to non priority emails as quickly as possible and within the windows given below.

Key Dates for appeals

JCQ Exam Boards - Priority Appeals

10 th August to 16 th August	Window for students to request a centre review
10 th August to 20 th August	Window for centre reviews to be conducted
10 th August to 23 rd August	Window for submitting appeals to the exam boards

JCQ Exam Boards - Non Priority Appeals

From Results Day to 3 rd September	Window for students to request a centre review
From Results Day to 10 th September	Window for centre reviews to be conducted
From Results Day to 17 th September	Window for submitting appeals to the exam boards

London Institute of Banking and Finance (Financial Studies exam board)

Level 3 Certificate/Diploma in Financial Studies – 10th September Level 2 Certificate in Financial Education – 13th September

If, after stage 2 of the process, you believe that the exam board has made a procedural error in handling your appeal you can apply to Ofqual's Exam Procedures Review Service to review the process undertaken by the exam board.

Additional Autumn Exam Series

Ofqual have announced that students who received a teacher assessed grade for general qualifications this Summer will also be eligible to take exams in the same subject in Autumn 2021.

If you wish to take advantage of this to improve on your grade you should contact the Exams Office for further information. The deadline for requesting entries will be Monday 6th September.

Certificates

Certificates are usually received in College late October/early November, you will be contacted around that time with further information on how these will be distributed or made available for you to collect.
