Aquinas careers team support the overarching strategic aims of the college to:

We encourage students to develop key universal skills, knowledge and attitudes that employers, universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers value and support our students to have a positive career. We are committed to provide a tailored and impartial approach for all students.

According to the Careers and Enterprise Company (CEC), the Gatsby Benchmarks "define what world class careers provision" looks like. By utilising the Gatsby Benchmarks to organise our careers provision around, the content and delivery of our career development programme can be designed around an evidence-based approach.

Gatsby Benchmark 1 asks that the careers programme is evaluated. We will do this by utilising the learning aims from Career Development Framework (Produced by the CDI) and the Essential skills as defined by the Skills Builder Framework. This will allow Aquinas to clarify what pupils should know and understand by the end of year 13.



All students will have access to the following careers-related activities, events and resources:

- Offer of 1-1 tailored Careers support/appointment with a Careers Adviser.
- Career Plan on MyAquinas which should be termly reviewed and updated by every student.
- Subscription to the Careers themed google classrooms.
- Access to weekly careers newsletters, produced by the Aguinas Careers Team.

- Access to the Careers section of the Aquinas Student Hub and careers resources for each subject area.
