The department is very well resourced and occupies a suite of classrooms together with other Social Science subjects: Psychology, Government and Politics, Health and Social Care and Criminology. Teaching materials are shared within the subject which has a collaborative approach to the production of resources and all aspects of learning, teaching and assessment.
